Tu B'Shevat is a time to have conversations on sustainability and environmental awareness. Michelle and Sheila will be ordained during the Saturday evening Havdala ceremony.

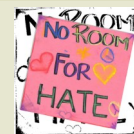
The Reason Rally

Adult Ed Recommends...

This movie is entertaining but also offers a fresh look at Muslim and Jewish tension and shows common ground shared with both groups of people.

Netflix Review:

This 2010 film was made in the UK and is available on Netflix as a CD or instant download. We enjoyed a short clip of the main character, Mahmood, learning how to act Jewish in preparation for attending a bar mitzvah.

We also recommend books and articles by the late Christopher Hitchens. Terry Fleisher shared a review of God is Not Great: How Religion Poisons Everything, which is probably Hitchens' best known book. We discussed the work of several "new atheists," including Hitchens, Sam Harris and Richard Dawkins.
